He reported that he used a company in New York State who make steel frame doors with rubberized edges which can be quickly installed at the first notice of an impending flood situation. Robert stated that we should probably speak with contractors or those who would best know how to head up such a project. Jeanne stated she would also ask her son about the company he works for and we should also speak with local contractors about the excavation work that might be needed as part of the flood proof process.
