TRAIL BUILDING

Recently presented to the selectboard by Lisa Crews, Kyle Senesac, and Brian Story was a trail building project that would create more trails for mountain biking and hikers on the Talc property. The group informed the board that they would be asking whether Act 250 would be required for their project; the selectboard gave their permission. Walter Pomroy is also involved.

RECREATION MANAGEMENT PLAN

There has been no talk of the above endeavor before it was brought up at the selectboard meeting and it illustrates perfectly why the CC should have a Recreation Management Plan. We should be able to be in on the ground level in such a situation. Lois pointed out the need for a list of parameters for groups to look at and consider when planning some kind of development, such as this one. It would be a good way to educate the public. We should compile such a list, present it to the selectboard as soon as possible, and present a case for mandatory inclusion of the JCC before any development on public land takes place. We should all go to this meeting and perhaps include a third party like Arrowwood Environmental to also attend.

After much fine-tuning, we finally perfected and approved this statement:

We request that the Selectboard make it their policy that formal comment from the Conservation Commission be a required component of any development idea or proposal on town property.

Thanks to Noel for mercifully coming up with the final version; we might still be at it if he hadn't.
