

## **Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP)**

- What is LIHWAP? It is a Federally Funded 'limited' Emergency Assistance Program, to help support water accessibility to low-income Vermonters, to ensure that they have access to drinking water and wastewater.
- Water Liability ~ Households will be required to have a water liability, in order to be eligible for the drinking water/wastewater program. Applicants will be required to provide a <u>copy of their current residential</u> <u>water/wastewater bill with their name on it</u>.
- How is eligibility determined? Eligibility is based on income, number of individuals in the household, and households with a vulnerable population, (including elderly, disabled, and young child under age 6). Households eligible for LIHEAP (Seasonal Fuel Assistance), SNAP (3SQVT), and TANF (Reach-UP) will be required to submit an application for the drinking water/wastewater program in order to be eligible for the benefit.
- ❖ How can these funds be used? These funds can assist households to reduce drinking water arrearages, prevent disconnections, and help pay back charges and fees. Households are eligible for one prospective benefit and a one-time arrearage payment to prevent disconnection or restore service. Any payment will be sent directly to the provider.
- How to Apply? Complete an Application for the Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program (201LIHWAP).
